Parents of Junior Members will be welcome to attend, but will not be eligible to vote unless they are members in their own right.

Under the rotation system all officers retire, but may offer themselves for re-election. Two committee members (R. Goldsmith and C. Waller) retire through the three year rotation system but both may offer themselves for re-election. Any nominations for new committee members or officers must be in writing and forwarded to the Secretary. The consent of the nominee should be obtained and the proposal seconded by a member.

- M. Rule 8(e) to be amended by removing the words “winter league only and”. This will allow non members to fish Society matches (other than Xmas Fayre).
- N. To remove rules 17(a) and 17 (b) and replace with the following rule, “A maximum of two rods may be used on any Society water”.

Dear Members,

The club has had in my opinion a very mixed season. I trust those members that did make the effort to fish on our waters had some pleasure from the visit. Some of the venues were not always up to standard with the many problems that occurred ie weed and algae on Buss Creek and No.2 pit, access to Pit 3 and the west end of Buss Creek restricted, not good. The fish stocking of No.1 Reydon should improve the catches but I believe we are in a situation these days where we have to make regular restocking on some of our waters in order to encourage more members to fish.

We have to move forward into some changes. Some of these are perhaps overdue; some not popular but to stay with the competition I do not believe we have a choice. To secure the future of this Society some difficult decisions will have to be taken and I trust, as in the past, I can rely on your support.

I hope many of you will attend the AGM. It was a good turn out at the Open members meeting with a very good structural discussion. I will try to move many of the suggestions forward but you will have to accept that these do come at a cost. That's fine, providing its reasonable and productive. Please support the proposals that have been put to the vote. Next season needs to improve. Weather conditions have an effect on many fishing waters but we can, with your support, find ways of sorting these and hopefully your season will be more

1. Those Present:

President Mr. Graham Denny and Mrs. Bridget Denny Chairman Mr. John Purdy and Treasurer Mrs. Pat Purdy Secretary Mr. Barry Reid and Membership Secretary Mrs. Beverley Reid Committee Members- Members and their Guests.

2. Chairman's Welcome to 34th AGM

The Chairman opened the proceedings by welcoming everyone to-

the 34th Meeting. He asked those present to observe a minute's silence in memory of two members – Richard Fulcher and Hubert Button – who had recently passed away.

3. Apologies

Apologies were received from Don Friston, Philip High, Archie Maclean, John and Jill Page.

4. To confirm and sign as a true record, if approved, the Minutes of the previous AGM held on Monday 25th April 2005.

Amendment to item 10A

Item 10A relates to the decision to keep Kessingland open during the traditional 'close' season. At the 2005 AGM when it was proposed and discussed with members, it was voted in favour but six were against. When voted at this meeting, all were in favour.

Proposed: Eric Peak **Seconded:** Colin Jacobs

This record as amended was unanimously adopted

5. To receive and adopt the Chairman's report

The Chairman spoke of the many changes taking place in Angling, particularly through climatic conditions. Aeration could be our biggest problem and we may have to invest in machinery. We invested a lot of money last year in re-stocking Kessingland but keeping it open during the 'close' season seems to have been successful.

The Reydon area is still the premier area although a lot of work needs to be done especially with flood schemes. Paisley's Pond (Pit 3) will be out of bounds for some time due to health and safety because of this work and all footpaths will be re-routed around that area. We are looking for ways to protect the waters from predators. Volunteers to form small

work parties will be required. The Buss Creek weed and reed problem cost us dearly last year. The river venues will be reduced slightly with the possibility of sharing with other clubs to reduce the cost.

Mr. Purdy thanked all the Committee Members for their continued support throughout the year and said that this year it is proposed to have a Vice-Chairman. Although the Fish Levy will be discussed in full later on, if it is accepted the money will help us with the re-stocking programme.

Proposed: Baz Honeywood **Seconded:**
This report was unanimously adopted.

6. To receive and adopt the Treasurers report

Copies of the audited balance sheet for the year were made available. Treasurer Pat Purdy went through the balance sheet and pointed out that subscription for this year are now due.

Proposed: Colin Jacobs **Seconded:** George Crisp
This report was unanimously adopted.

7. To receive and adopt the Match Report

Barry Reid (the secretary) pointed out that a limited number of matches had been organised last year and thanked Eric Peak for running the majority of them and the members who had attended. Eric is standing down this year. We have not had a match secretary now for three years and Archie Maclean, the match administrator stood down last year. Eric Peek stated that in the summer series, maximum of 13 fishermen (average 9) attended while in the winter series, maximum of 10 fishermen (average 6) attended.

Les Ellis and Peter Turrell will try to help out this season but, because many of our members also belong to other local clubs, we must ensure no duplication of matches takes

place. Eric Peek has already supplied a list of matches. We are trying to support Kessingland Fishing Club, subject to certain conditions, in their bid for the Angling Times Super Cup.

This report was unanimously adopted.

8. President's Address

President Graham Denny welcomed everybody to the evening although he was appalled at the lack of attendees considering the club has a membership of 475. He was also disappointed at the turnout for the junior event and it was confirmed by the Chairman that, due to the work being at Reydon, the next junior event will not take place until 2007. In conclusion he thanked the Committee members for their work throughout the year.

9. To consider the Committee's recommendations

9A. That the annual subscription for all classes of membership remains as last year, that is Seniors £28.00, Senior Citizen and Disabled Members £14,00 and Junior Members £7.00.

Eric Peek said that although juniors become seniors when they left school, some students stay at school until they are 18 and have a problem raising the money for their fishing membership, especially now with the £10 fishing levy.

The Chairman said that this had been discussed fully in previous years and it had been agreed that anyone 16 or over would be classed as an adult to keep in line with the fishing licences. However, he agreed that the Committee would be prepared to look further into this another year. He also suggested that if anyone had serious finance difficulties in paying for their fishing they could contact him personally.

Proposed: Colin Jacobs **Seconded:** Bryan Coe
This recommendation was unanimously adopted.

9B. That the new member joining fee for all classes other than Juniors remains as last year, that is £10.00. (Junior Members no fee as before)

Proposed: Tony Oxley **Seconded:** Baz Honeywood
This recommendation was unanimously adopted.

9C. That the cost of Day Memberships remain unchanged i.e. Seniors £5.00, Senior Citizens £3.00, Juniors £1.50.

Proposed: Colin Jacobs **Seconded:** Ron Carroll
This recommendation was unanimously adopted.

The Chairman said that to help the financial situation, more day tickets will be allowed this year but will not include Sundays. These are available from Sam Hook in Lowestoft and Purdy's Newsagents in Southwold after 9am.

9D. That the cost of Guest Membership remains unchanged i.e. Seniors £7.00, Senior Citizens £5.00, Juniors £2.00

Proposed: Bryan Coe **Seconded:** Rodney Goldsmith
This recommendation was accepted by all but one member

The Chairman reminded members that all guests must be accompanied and that guests were allowed to fish from dawn onwards and Sundays was included. He also stressed the importance of ensuring purchase of fishing licences as there will be more environmental bailiffing this season. It was confirmed that guest tickets can be purchased in block form. Henham is included for day tickets this year.

9E. That for the 2006/7 season, a 'one off' fish levy of £10.00 must be paid by all classes of member other than junior members (members joining the Society this year will not have to pay the levy until the 2007/8 subscription renewal)

Eric Peek pointed out that if there is more than one person in

the household, this could be very expensive. The Chairman confirmed that the money raised by this levy would be used totally for the Reydon re-stocking programme, particularly in Sherwood Water.

The question was asked "how secure is the water, if we are spending all this money on restocking?" The President stated that his Company Wm.Denny owned the waters and as far as he could see, it was in petuity. He said that if the SDFAPS did not fish it, then no other fishing club would.

Another member raised the question of non-secure platforms and the Chairman pointed out that, particularly on Sherwood, they had to be very discreet as the platforms could be seen from the windows of the adjoining houses.

A member queried if we intended filling Sherwood with hybrids which would make this a commercial fishery. He wanted confirmation the current fish will be protected. The Secretary said that the suggested species would be roach, bream and tench, not carp.

A member said that the Koi carp in Kessingland were being systematically stolen and this will be looked into. The secretary confirmed that the large Koi still in Kingfisher Lake were put in at least twenty years ago.

The new SDFAPS Disability Representative, Tony Oxley, was introduced to members and he said that one of the best ways of getting funding through grants is by match funding to enhance fisheries as a whole. He also suggested that if we can use the fish levy money for re-stocking, it may be matched by a grant thus doubling the amount we raised.

A member questioned if the Committee made the decision on what fish to buy and he was told to send in his points of view and they would be carefully considered by the Committee.

Proposed: Ron Carroll **Seconded:** Eric Peek
The motion was carried – 36 for and 6 against.

9F. That the honorary officer position of Vice Chairman is created.

The Chairman explained the need for a Vice Chairman and Barry Reid's name was put forward. Lilian Oxley has volunteered to undertake some of Barry's workload under his instruction medium term.

This recommendation was unanimously accepted.

Proposed: Eric Peek **Seconded:** Tony Oxley

9G. To introduce the following rule 27:

27(a) An Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) may be called at any time by the secretary at the request in writing of ten or more members on giving to all members at least 14 days prior notice in writing (except in the case of an emergency).

Eric Peek felt that the '14 days prior notice' needs clarifying and proposed that a full stop be put after the words 'notice in writing' and that the 'e' in 'except in the case of' should be made into a capital letter. This was agreed.

27(b) The business which may be conducted at an EGM is:

- Expulsion of members (further advice needs to be taken on this)
- Changes in the rules of the Society
- The dissolution of the Society
- The removal of an officer

27© Thirty members shall form a quorum at an EGM. An AGM can be called to change this number if required.

27(d) All decision at an EGM shall be by two thirds majority

with the chairman of the meeting (in addition to his ordinary vote) exercising a casting vote in the case of a deadlock.

Proposed: Eric Peek **Seconded:** Keith Wink
This recommendation was unanimously accepted with the alteration in 27(a).

9H. Rule 16 to be amended by the addition of rule 16(b) to prevent the use of keepnets at Kessingland Lake except during matches. Amended rule to read "16(b) Keepnets must not be used at Kessingland Lake unless in a match in accordance with match rule 11".

Proposed: Eric Peek Seconded: Colin Jacobs
This motion was carried – 37 for, 3 against.

10. Comfort Break.

A ten minute break taken.

11. To consider any other business

No proposals were received for consideration at the AGM by the required date of March 1st 2006 (rule 5b).

12. Presentation of T.I.G.E.R. Trophy

No nominations were put forward for this year. The Committee would be pleased to receive nominations for future years.

13. To elect Officers and committee for the ensuing year:

(Under the rotation system, all Officers stand down but may offer themselves for re-election. Subject to the meeting agreeing item 9(i), the position of Vice Chairman will be added to the list of honorary officers positions to be filled. Two existing Committee members, Frank Courtman and Keith

Wink stand down under the normal three year rotation rule, both have offered themselves for re-election).

**Minutes of S&DFAPS
Extraordinary General Meeting
held at
The Royal British Legion Club, Southwold
27th February 2007 at 8pm**

1. Chairman's Welcome

The Chairman, John Purdy, opened the proceedings by welcoming everyone to the meeting. Approximately 40 members attended.

2. Apologies

Apologies were received from Keith Wink and Lloyd Mitchell.

3. Agenda Items

3A. To remove rule 6(b) "All new members must be proposed and seconded in writing by two members of the Society" and renumber rules 6(c), 6(d) and (6c) respectively.

It was explained that this removal would enable the Club to re-apply for a disabled anglers grant from the AFA (Awards for All) which was previously refused because the Club did not have 'open' membership i.e. each new member had to be proposed and seconded. The Grant was rejected solely on this issue.

Our waters have always been open to the general public via day and guest tickets and disabled anglers have specific swims which they can fish free of charge (whether or not they are a member), providing they obtain a day ticket from Purdy's Newsagents Southwold for insurance purposes and they hold a current fishing licence.

However, whilst we can still have a proposer and seconder on the application form if required, the wording must be

changed in the rule book to reflect the above change. A member said he was concerned about this still being put on the application form as this could foul things up again with any grant request but it was pointed out that an application form is not sent with the grant request, only the rule book..

A member said he was surprised to hear about the disabled anglers fishing free of charge or that the public who were not members could come onto our waters and fish, as he had been a member for many years and this was the first time he had heard of it. The question was raised about age limits and it was confirmed that any angler over 70 could also use the disabled swims.

It was suggested that this information should be shown in the Rule Book. This has been well publicised and is known to the Disabled Access people. Also leaflets have been provided in the past, although there are now new members who need to be told so perhaps it should be done again and also be inserted into the membership book.

The question was raised whether applicants who are refused entrance to the club would receive the courtesy of a reply under the F.O.I. It was pointed out that the F.O.I. does not apply to clubs and associations but this will be looked at and checked again.

SECONDED : Les Ellis

Item 3A to remove the rule was voted on -
1 member abstained, all others agreed.

3B. To adopt the following rule – Neither the officers of the Association nor any Trustees appointed by the Association to hold property on its behalf shall not be liable (otherwise than as a member) for any loss suffered by the Association as a result of the discharge of their respective duties on its behalf (except where such loss results from their wilful neglect or

default) and they shall be entitled to an indemnity out of the assets of the Association for all expenses and other liabilities incurred by them in the discharge of their respective duties.

If we go down this road, some trustees would need to be appointed who would have a financial obligation and therefore S&DFAPS would have to pay insurance costs. Whilst we are trying to keep the rules in position for the Trust, there are also other rules that should be in place, whether or not we form the Trust and we should have a rule to give some level of protection to anyone who comes forward as a Trustee, a committee member or an officer.

With regard to day and guest ticket anglers, they automatically become a temporary member for that day and are covered under 'public liability'. This is the very reason they are supposed to look at the rules which are on the back of the ticket and abide by them.

PROPOSED : Barry Reid **SECONDED** : Tony Oxley

A member said that SDFAPS was a Society and not an Association as shown in item 4 above and proposed an amendment. This was agreed by all. The same member pointed out that the first sentence in Item 4 did not make sense and should be changed to read as follows: "To adopt the following rule – The officers of the Society or any Trustees appointed by the Society to hold property on its behalf etc (i.e leave out the word 'Neither', and take out the word 'nor' and insert 'or' in its place.)

PROPOSED : Eric Peek **SECONDED** : Don Friston

Item 3B as amended above re Society and changes was voted on: 1 abstained, all others agreed.

3C. To adopt the following rule – An expelled member shall

forfeit all rights and privileges of membership but shall remain liable for any dues or debts to the Society which became payable or were incurred before the date of expulsion.

The Solicitor who is checking our Rule Book said there is nothing in our book that highlighted member liability and that, if a member is expelled, then any liability that comes about whilst that member is a member of the Club, should continue even after that member is expelled.

PROPOSED : Tony Oxley **SECONDED**:Terry Swan

A member felt that the wording could exonerate an expelled member and suggested that the one sentence in item 5 should be replaced with the following three sentences:

An expelled member shall forfeit all rights and privileges of membership.

The expelled member shall remain liable for any dues or debts to the Society which became payable or were incurred before the date of expulsion.

The expelled member shall remain liable for any debts to the Society incurred subsequent to the date of expulsion as a consequence of actions by the member prior to the date of expulsion.

The Chairman said that the sentence as it stands could make the Society vulnerable and agreed to seek further legal advice on this before it is put to the vote. The member then said that if the Committee and members present wanted to ratify this, it could be adopted tonight, with the proviso that a solicitor be contacted and if any modification was needed it could be done and brought to the AGM for agreement.

PROPOSED : Eric Peek **SECONDED** : Peter Turrell

A member was not happy with the third sentence and felt it could be made shorter. The principle is right but the wording is wrong. It was then suggested that there was another amendment to agree the first two but leave the third one in abeyance until the AGM

PROPOSED : Barry Reid **SECONDED** : Bryan Coe

A vote to agree sentences (i) and (ii) but leave (iii) until the AGM was taken – 1 abstained, all others agreed.

The Extraordinary General Meeting closed at 8.40pm.

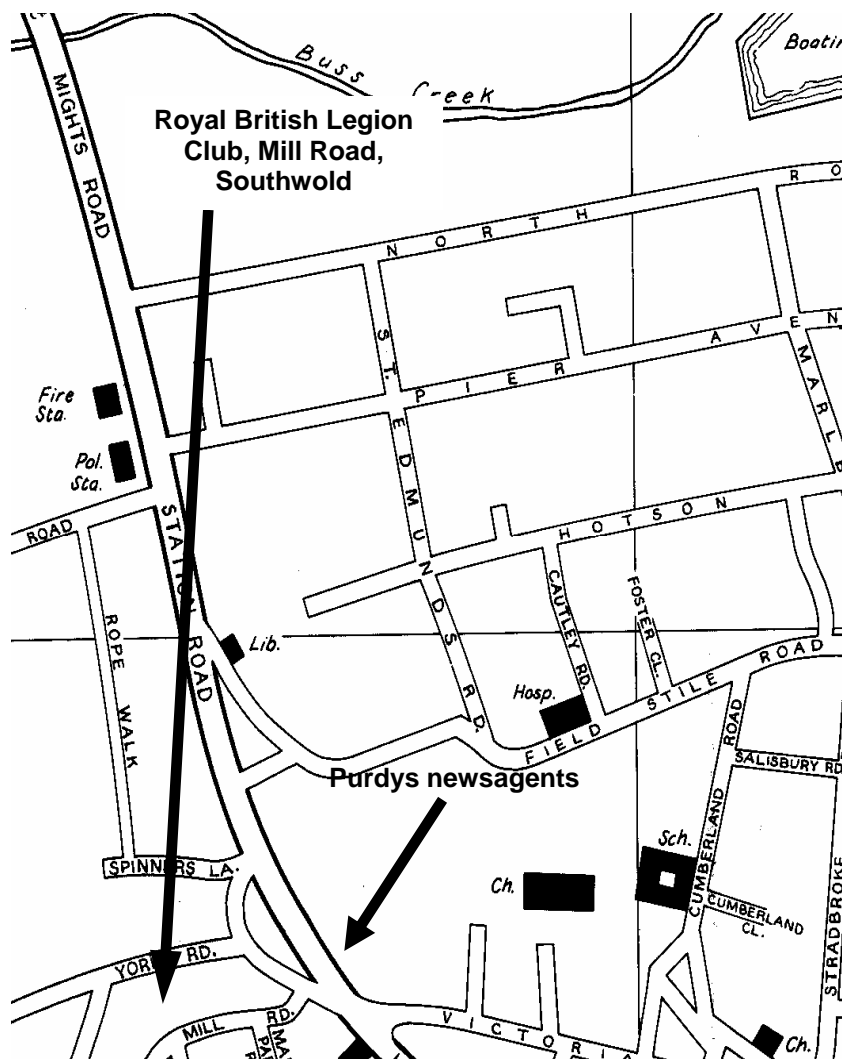
